STEAM Days

Starting this fall, our students will engage in STEAM days every Wednesday. These activities aim to provide hands-on learning experiences across Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math domains. Through a variety of interactive activities, students will gain proficiency in STEAM principles, focusing on computer science and coding, through Nativity Prep partnering with two external organizations, Capital One Coding and Avi I.T.

Avi I.T. is a Wilmington-based non-profit organization. They designed their curriculum with a social-emotional learning perspective, creating space for open discussions related to S.T.E.M. subjects and the challenges students may encounter. Avi I.T. encourages students to express themselves through their work and introduces them to the world of








computer science as a potential profession. Students will explore topics such as Robotics, Virtual Reality, Artificial Intelligence, Game Development, and Coding using the Scratch application.

Capital One Coding facilitates a connection between their technologists and local school students and youth-serving nonprofits during a crucial phase of student development. Together, they delve into areas such as mobile app development, web design, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and other cutting-edge technologies through engaging hands-on mentorship. This 12-week cohort program is held in both the fall and spring months. At the culmination of each cohort, students have the opportunity to showcase their creations and knowledge gained through the mentorship partnership. NP

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
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
